Responsible for the assessment, observation, and treatment of patients within the emergency department, in all different circumstances and stages of care. Competent in observations, medication administration, plastering, venipuncture and cannula insertion, ECG, cardiac monitoring, IV fluid administration, wound care and facilitating diagnostics such as X ray, CT and ultrasound scanning, to name but a few. Each patient has an individual and often complex past medical history alongside their initial presentation of symptoms which makes knowledge of anatomy and physiology pivotal in order to correctly assess and treat patients. Often working in the resuscitation area of the department, responsible for time critical patient management, including trauma related cases which often require specialist and skilled management, and both mental health and paediatric presentations.
